Hospice Team

Patient's Physician & Hospice's Medical Director	Oversees the plan of care; work collaboratively with Hospice of the Red River Valley physician and nurse practitioners
Nurse Practitioner (NP)	Works closely with Hospice physicians to provide medical care to hospice patients by managing the symptoms of their illnesses
	Provides support through teaching, advocating and training
	Provides expertise in pain and symptom management
Nurse (RN)	Visits as often as necessary to assess medical needs
	Offers support 24/7 to respond to a crisis or medical emergency, and assists family in caregiver role
Certified Nursing Assistant	Helps with personal care needs, such as feeding, bathing, shaving or nail care
(CNA)	Offers light housekeeping services
	Provides emotional support for patients and loved ones
Social Worker	Helps resolve issues that may occur with a prolonged illness
	Assists in navigating the health care environment, and identifies and connects you with community resources for additional support
	Provides spiritual support to patients of all faiths, if desired
Chaplain	Communicates with patient's or family's clergy
	Assists with funeral arrangements
Volunteer	Provides companionship to patients, and offers caregiver respite support
Volunteer	Assists in the office, at special events, and in special roles, such as pet therapists and hair stylists
	Offers 13 months of grief support services for loved ones
Grief Specialist	Provides free grief and loss support groups, which are available to all community members
	Serves as a community resource and speaks about death, dying and end-of-life
